

Suggested Four-Year Plan with YEAR-LONG music course selections
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Dedication to a specific course of study, i.e. music, looks very favorable to college application committees. Selecting a course plan that demonstrates passion in a specific area, whether it is arts, sciences, languages, helps to paint a more complete picture of the individual applicant.

Musicians demonstrate the ability to concentrate, to think creatively, to follow through, to work well as a team, and to manage their time. Application committees understand the added requirements of practice, concert attendance, private lessons, etc. and look very favorably on student musicians. SDA musicians have been accepted to UC Berkeley, UCLA, UCSD, USC, Purdue, NYU and many more selective universities, where they pursue studies in a variety of different majors.
